This newsletter edition of Squire's Stories begins back in the spring of 1985. A young trumpet player from the Westside of Youngstown heard from his mom that a local band was going to be touring in Europe for the summer.

With the idea of being able to play his horn and to run about in Europe to his liking, this 18 year old decided to join. Despite not knowing anyone in the band, or even who Squire was, he was hooked.

As many had before and since, he made friends at camp, had the summer of his life, and remained a member of the band for a total of 3 years. Like most of us, many of the friends he made during these years are still his best friends today.

He became quite enamored with the ideals of discipline and respect that Squire sought to teach all of his students. This direction lead him later in life to enlist in the United States Marine Corps.


