Paul Larsen, An Alumni Remembered 1954-2009

"He was a fun-loving guy. He spent 20 years in the Marine Corps. He was in Beirut, Lebanon, Gulf War and on the invasion of Grenada. He spent time serving his country as a good citizen," said Chris Larsen, the brother of Paul Larsen.

Paul Larsen died Tuesday March 17th after being struck by two cars on South Avenue in Youngstown, Ohio. Youngstown police are still searching for the driver that initially hit Larsen, but drove away.

A Mass of Christian Burial took place on Saturday, March 21, at St. Columba Cathedral.

Paul was born March 10, 1957 in Warren, the son of C. Otto and E. Helen Stacher Larsen.

He graduated from Matthews High School in 1975. Immediately following, Paul enlisted in the U.S. Marine Corps, serving his country for 20 years. He served in Beirut, Granada, Desert Storm, Japan, Persian Gulf, Camp Leleune and Camp Pendleton. He was in the Marine Corps Band, served as a recruiter and amphibian crewman later retiring as a Gunnery Sergeant in 1995. After his military career, Paul worked as a diesel mechanic and formerly worked for J.P. Hunt Trucking. He was a member of St. Columba, the retired Marine Corps Association.

Paul will also be remembered by his WJMB family. The number of his fellow alumni that turned out to pay respects to Paul would not only have

It was with great pleasure that we were finally able to secure Pam Raidel (Potter) to serve as our organizations treasurer. Pam has spent the past many years in the employ of Home Savings & Loan in the Youngstown area and is currently a Vice-President at the new Austintown location on Mahoning Ave. in front of the Home Depot. On to the financial business of the alumni association. As stated in past newsletters, our organization is most fortunate in that we need very little money to operate. It is fortunate because that is what we have. Very little money. As of 01/31/2009, our checking account balance was \$1,621.00. With total accounts payable at \$929.68 for items related to the Winter Mix and past newsletter expenses, not to mention monthly web hosting

fees, our total capital ends up at \$711.97. With the newsletter costing about \$300 per publication, along with other mailings and expenses for the summer picnic, our estimated annual financial needs to cover costs are about \$1500.00. This relates to only needing 75 alumni to pay their annual \$20 donation and we can keep this organization operating and providing the same services to our members. Thanks for helping!
